



First Sunday

School has started. Do you know what your child's most important school supply is? YOU, THEIR PARENT!! Your child's education is a critical ingredient to their success

in life. Go to open house, meet your child's teacher. If a child knows you are interested, he or she will be more likely to do better in school. Show you care! Get involved!

Third Sunday

Your body is your temple. Let's help our children take care of it. Regularly visit the dentist, eye doctor, and pediatrician. Be a good example and provide nutritious choices for your child. The stage is set at a young age for life long health and nutrition habits. Have your child drink water and milk instead of juice and soft drinks. Encourage outdoor play. If they see you eating well, they'll want to do the same!



Fifth Sunday

Your child is your best investment! The law of sowing and reaping applies to school success. We have always heard that whatever we sow, we will also reap. If you set good habits early, such as being on time and eating together, then both you and they will reap great things. A family game night helps teach your child valuable lessons which they will pass on.



Second Sunday

No need for high priced gimmicks. As parents, get involved by finding "smart moments" to engage your child's natural curiosity. Spend time outdoors. Watch appropriate TV together and ask questions to extend learning. Tell your child about your faith and instill family traditions. By finding smart moments every day, you will give your child a valuable gift-the love of learning.

Fourth Sunday

What is always the answer to this question- "Do you have any homework?...No" Parents, don't take no for an answer. Check your child's class work. Ask why-children often do. Make the connection and keep the lines of communication open. Let your children know you care enough to ask questions, listen to their answers and really be involved in their lives-and show that you want to STAY involved.

Sixth Sunday

Have you read a book today with your child? No matter your child's age reading unlocks many doors for children. Help them set good habits now to read for pleasure and for learning. Show your children you care by reading with them. Get involved and STAY involved.
