ALABAMA CARES SUPPORTS YOU AND YOUR LOVED ONE WITH THESE CORE SERVICES

INFORMATION on resources and other services available within the community.

ASSISTANCE in accessing services and resources through short-term case management.

MONTHLY SUPPORT GROUPS where caregivers openly share experiences and concerns with each other in a safe haven and relaxed atmosphere.

RESPITE SERVICES offering temporary relief to caregivers so that they can have time for themselves. Due to limited funding, those with the greatest needs receive priority.

COUNSELING and guidance to help family caregivers make decisions and solve problems.

TRAINING to improve family caregivers' knowledge and skills related to caregiving.

SUPPLEMENTAL PRODUCTS AND SERVICES available on a limited basis to complement care.

WHO QUALIFIES FOR THESE SERVICES?

- Primary family caregivers of frail adults age 60+.
- Older relative caregivers (not parents), including grandparents age 55+, caring for children age 18 and younger.
- Parents and older relative caregivers, including grandparents age 55+, caring for adults age 19 to 59 with disabilities.
- There are no income restrictions; however those with the greatest social and economic needs receive priority.
