Since 1975, The Arc of Walker County has advocated and provided services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Our services include early intervention, day programs, supported employment, supported living and a residential program with 24-hour assistance. Individualized plans for educational and social opportunities as well as employment interests are designed for those age 18 and older. We strive to help those served by The Arc live independently with dignity as active, productive citizens in their community.
